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Beginning Teaching Stories From The
Instruction for the Beginning Reader in Spanish. Much of early reading instruction in English is devoted to teaching children the English vowel sounds. Like Spanish, English has five vowel letters (a, e, i, o, and u), but those five letters can make 12 different vowel sounds, depending on the spelling patterns of the words in which they occur.
