Introduction from the NIV Study Bible | Go to Exodus Title “Exodus” is a Latin word derived from Greek Exodos, the name given to the book by those who translated it into Greek. The word means “exit,” “departure” (see Lk 9:31; Heb 11:22).The name was retained by the Latin Vulgate, by the Jewish author Philo (a contemporary of Christ) and by the Syriac version.

There is no consensus among scholars as to the date when the events of the exodus took place. A common view is that the exodus occurred in c. 1446 b.c. This is based on the calculation of 480 years from Israel’s departure from Egypt to the fourth year of Solomon’s reign (c. 966 b.c. ; see 1 Kings 6:1).
